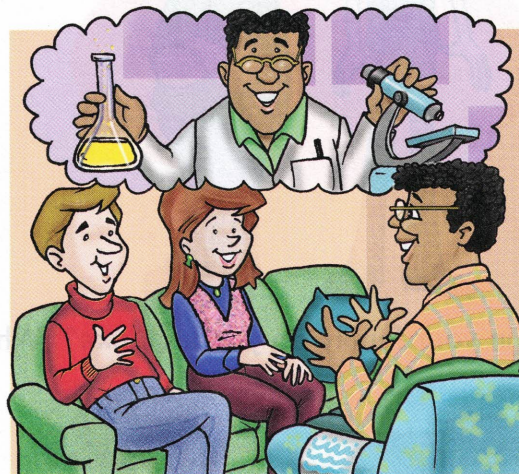


CLOSE FRIENDS
